# 1. Pets can be powerful emotional support after a breakup

According to Dr. Chandni Tugnait, pets offer comfort, routine, and a sense of companionship that can be incredibly grounding when navigating a breakup. "Your pet becomes your cuddle buddy, your reason to get out of bed, and the one who's always happy to see you—no breakup involved," she says.

#### 2. Be honest about who the pet really belongs to

In relationships where pets are shared—or were a gift from an ex—it's important to have an honest conversation about who's better equipped emotionally and practically to care for the animal. "The dog may have been a gift, but if you've been the primary caregiver, it's okay to speak up," Dr. Chandni advises.

#### 3. Visiting your ex to see the pet? Set clear boundaries

Still dropping by your ex's place to see the dog? That's sweet... but complicated. "If it's keeping you emotionally stuck or causing confusion, it might be time to create some distance," Dr. Chandni says. "Consider what's best for both you and your pet in the long run."

"A shared love for pets can also be a beautiful way to connect with someone new," she adds. "Include them in your dating profile, go on pet-friendly first dates, and let your pet be part of your journey as you move on and open up to new possibilities."
